## A Walk through the Monastery Chronicles since Autumn 2021

#### Giving Thanks - Sr. Miriam Esther's First Profession of Vows

We begin our account of this "year of favor" with the First Profession of our novice, **Sr. Miriam Esther of the Sacred Heart.** Sister had spent the last two years preparing and longing for the day when she could profess the five Passionist vows, and on October 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021, that long-awaited day finally arrived! The weather was cool and rainy, but nothing could dampen the spirits of the eager bride as she offered her life to Christ Crucified.

The Mass of Religious Profession was celebrated by our own Bishop William F. Medley, and the homilist was Fr. Martin Martiny, OP (prior of Sister's home parish, St. Louis Bertrand in Louisville KY). Friends and family came from near and far to share in the joy of the occasion.

At the climax of the ceremony, Sister Miriam Esther pronounced the Passion Vow and the vows of chastity, poverty, obedience, and enclosure in the hands of Mother John Mary, for a period of three

years. She then received the black veil and Passion sign as a symbol of her new identity as a bride of Jesus Crucified. We thank God for the gift of Sister's vocation!

#### Giving Thanks - New Discerners to Passionist Life

"Enlarge the space for your tent, spread out your tent cloths unsparingly ..."

This verse from Isaiah 54:2 has been on our minds quite a bit this year, as we have needed to expand seating in chapel and refectory for some new arrivals! We all agree that it is a *wonderful* problem to have, and one for which we are deeply grateful.

On *November 9th,* live-in visitor **Holly** (from Cincinnati) was accepted to the aspirancy! She came to visit monthly for most of the year, and in August she arrived for a 3-month live-in to discern our life more deeply.

On *May 31st,* we had the great joy of welcoming Aspirant **Hannah** to officially enter the monastery! Accompanied by her parents, Joe and Cathy, Hannah knelt at the enclosure door and made her formal request to enter the postulancy. Mother John Mary and the assembled community of Sisters were more than happy to accept, and to offer the Sign of Peace to our newest member! It is such joy to have a Postulant around again. Hannah is now living full-time at the monastery, seeking to enter more deeply into our Passionist contemplative life as she continues her discernment with us.

Our community celebrations only increased as the summer progressed. On August 15<sup>th</sup> – the Solemnity of Our Lady's Assumption into Heaven – we had the great joy of witnessing the Perpetual Profession of Sr. Frances Marie of the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus!

All five of Sister's brothers, as well as her parents, sister-in-law, grandfather, aunt, and two of her cousins were able to attend, and a large group of friends from near and far filled the chapel. The main celebrant was Fr. Tony Hollowell (a friend from the Indianapolis Archdiocese), and the homilist was Fr. Paul Cygan (a long-time family friend who grew up with the "Wenke kids"). It was with great emotion that we watched Sister lie prostrate before the altar, covered with the black funeral pall that symbolized her death to the world. She then "rose with Christ" and professed the five Passionist vows in the hands of Mother John Mary – perpetually!

The festivities continued that evening with Eucharistic Adoration and solemn Vespers. Deacon Matt Wenke (Sister Frances Marie's father) gave a beautiful and sometimes emotional homily about the connections between the Assumption and his daughter's vocation. There are truly no words to express our gratitude and joy for the gift of our Sister and her Passionist vocation. May God be praised for another perpetually professed Bride of the Crucified!

#### Construction Begins!

Excavation and foundation work on the cloister walkways has proceeded well, despite what our general contractor, Rick Bivins, called "the worst dirt I've ever seen!" Our Kentucky clay has hardened into rock just a few inches below the topsoil, posing a challenge for the backhoes and shovels. Thank God for jackhammers! Once we have the footer release permit for the new wing we hope to also do that foundation work in 2022, before wet winter weather sets in – "Good Lord willin' and the creek don't rise," as they say in Kentucky!

#### Giving Thanks - Just Half a Million to Go!

As we come to an end of our quick jaunt through the monastery chronicles of this past year we leave you with a few fundraising stories.

Now, elementary school students aren't usually wealthy – but they gave their "two cents worth" by starting a classroom "Penny War for the Passionists!" Thus, this September a group of students were able to present us with a substantial check towards our Cherish the Flame campaign. May God reward you!

In our last Cherish the Flame Progress Report we shared that an anonymous family generously agreed to sponsor a \$100,000 matching grant, beginning June 17<sup>th</sup> lasting through September 15<sup>th</sup>. Thanks to your generosity we were overwhelmed during those three months by the response we received! We received more than enough funds to receive the gift of the grant. We are so grateful to this family and to all of you. May the Lord reward you 1000-fold!

After a long and eventful three years, we are close to reaching our Cherish the Flame fundraising goal! Construction prices are in flux with the pandemic-related supply chain issues and labor shortages, but the Lord continues to provide what we need for each step. As of the end of October over \$3,510,000 has been raised. Will you help us reach the goal?
